Admission criteria

Murdoch College has stringent procedures in place to assess whether a student's qualifications, experience and English language proficiency are appropriate to gain entry to study at the College. Admissions requirements can be found in our <u>Admissions Policy</u>.

A. Applicants with higher education study

Entry into Diploma courses requires successful completion of Year 12 with an ATAR of 50; or successful completion of a Foundation Studies program from recognized Australian Universities/ Colleges; or a CERT IV from TAFE.

в. Applicants with vocational education and training (VET) study

Entry into Diploma courses requires successful completion of a VET qualification at Certificate IV.

c. Applicants with recent secondary education (within the past two years)

Entry into Diploma courses requires an ATAR of 50 or equivalent. For school leavers entering undergraduate courses the College offers adjustment factors, outlined in the <u>Admissions Policy</u>.

D. Applicants with work and life experience

Mature age students (21 years of age and over) may be admitted to a course without meeting academic entry requirements where they can demonstrate the attainment of relevant and recognised prior learning experience.



Additional information

Domestic applicants with overseas qualifications

Overseas qualifications will be assessed for equivalence in Australia at the time of application using the Country Education Profiles (CEP) and/or ECCTIS online tool. AQF qualifications and providers will be verified using one of the Australian government's registers, such as Training.gov.au (TGA) and the TEQSA National Register.

English language proficiency

Applicants whose secondary school education, undergraduate or postgraduate qualification was not completed in English or whose work in the industry was not carried out in English must demonstrate levels of English proficiency as outlined in the Admissions Policy.

Enrolment

All students who possess prior learning may submit evidence of such and apply for recognition. The College may award exemption towards the achievement of an award of various forms of prior learning.
