Western Australia's economy is export-oriented, with around half of Australia's exports of goods originating from the state each year, including minerals, petroleum, agri-food and specialised manufactured goods. WA also attracts many international visitors and students.

These export industries support employment across the WA economy resulting in one of the best opportunities for students to live and work part time. Thanks to WA's mining industry, the state boasts the biggest takehome pay packet of the nation.



Why study Foundation Studies with us?

Foundation Studies prepares you for successful transition to degree-level study, providing a pathway to the first year of study of a bachelor degree at Murdoch University. This program has been specifically designed for international students.

Pathway to any Degree

This course is suited to you if:

- you need an entrance qualification for Murdoch University
- you want to accelerate your university preparation after Year 11, or equivalent
- · you want to change your degree stream after Year 11, or equivalent

On successful completion* of your Foundation Studies program, you'll gain entry to the first year of most undergraduate degrees at Murdoch University, with the exception of Veterinary Science, Nursing and Education. Veterinary Science can be accessed through the Bachelor of Agricultural Science (Animal Science).

*A higher requirement and specific subject scores are required for Law.

Structure and Pathway

In the Foundations Studies program you will complete eight units over two study periods, studying a combination of core and elective units. The units you undertake will be determined by your chosen degree. Each unit of study builds concepts from an introductory level through to university entrance level. The units are designed to develop your learning techniques as well as bridging gaps in your academic knowledge.

Why Study a Murdoch University Preparation Course?

Our Murdoch University Preparation Course (MUPC) is very similar to the Foundation Studies Program however it has 2 variations — a standard course delivered over 3 trimesters and made up of 9 units and an accelerated version made up of 4 units and delivered over 1 trimester.

MUPC students study the same units as Foundation Studies students with a reduced study load to support their progression. Entry requirements, fees and articulation requirements for the MUPC course are the same as those for a Foundation Studies course.

The standard variation of our MUPC is a 9-unit course which is delivered over 3 trimesters and gives students the time they need to develop the necessary skills to succeed in their university studies.

The program is suited to you if:

- · you don't have the high school results for you to gain entry to your chosen bachelor degree
- you want to change your degree stream
- · you need to increase your chances of entering highly competitive courses at Murdoch University

MUPC (Accelerated) has been designed for students who narrowly missed the direct entry requirements for the degree program of their choice and provides them with the opportunity to improve their academic knowledge, and English language skills to enter university via a course which is appropriate to their previous level of study.

Western Australia's only Veterinary Science course provides the opportunity to develop the knowledge, skills and practical experience necessary to solve the existing and emerging problems of our companion animals, livestock and wildlife.


With a science-based approach and hands-on experience this course prepares you for the highest standard of work in the veterinary industry. To become a qualified veterinarian, you will need to complete the Bachelor of Science (Veterinary Biology) + Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree over five years. Direct entry to this degree is extremely competitive and while possible most students would seek an alternative pathway to this qualification.

Students who successfully complete the Murdoch College Foundation

Studies Program, Murdoch University Preparation Course or the Murdoch University Preparation Course (Accelerated) can gain admission to the Bachelor of Agricultural Science (Animal Science). On successful completion of the first year of this degree students can progress, with advanced standing to the Bachelor of Science (Veterinary Biology) + Doctor of Veterinary Medicine.

How to enter Veterinary Science from a pathway program?

Students who do a year of the Bachelor of Agricultural Science (Animal Science) before transferring to Vet Science perform just as well as (or better than) students who start Vet Science directly.

Minimum requirements to transfer to Bachelor of Science (Veterinary Biology) + Doctor of Veterinary Medicine

To transfer to the Bachelor of Science (Veterinary Biology) + Doctor of Veterinary Medicine from the Bachelor of Agricultural Science (Animal Science) you'll need the following.

- Minimum of 1 year (full-time equivalent) or 21 credit points (or equivalent) of the Bachelor of Agricultural Science (Animal Science).
- Minimum of 35 hours of veterinary-related experience, i.e. work experience with a veterinarian.
- Minimum academic performance: tertiary GPA >2.5 (out of 4) or >5.5 (out of 7) during your B Agricultural Science.
- Completion of the BSC/DVM Admissions Statement and associated declarations
- Completion of Casper assessment. Casper is an openresponse situational judgement test (SJT) that evaluates social intelligence and professionalism.

Your future career

When you graduate you will be prepared for a career in animal health related fields, with animals of all species and sizes. You could work in primary care or emergency hospitals, in small animal practice, in large animal or mixed practice, or as a government veterinarian. Careers could include:

- · Veterinary Clinician in private practice or academia
- Industry Consultant in agriculture, equestrian sport, animal welfare, animal behaviour
- Government Veterinarian, working on biosecurity, food security, herd disease and management
- Researcher in all aspects related to animal health and welfare, including animal models of disease

You could undertake specialist training in a wide range of clinical disciplines such as surgery, medicine, pathology, reproduction, or dermatology.




